## Zin Obelisk cards

The basic measurement of time in Atlantis is a day.	What is a cubitt?
An Atlantian day is divided into schlibs and ponks.	A cubitt is a cube, all sides of which measure 1 megalithic yard.
The length of the zin is 50 feet.	There are 3 and a half feet in a megalithic yard.
The height of the zin is 100 feet.	Does work take place on Sunday?
The width of the zin is 10 feet	What is a zin?
The zin is built of stone blocks.	Which way up does the zin stand?

Each block is 1 cubic foot.	The zin is made up of green blocks.
Day 1 in the Atlantian week is called Aquaday.	Green has special religious significance on Mermaidday.
Day 2 in the Atlantian week is called Neptiminus.	Each gang includes two women.
Day 3 in the Atlantian week is called Sharkday.	Work starts at daybreak on Aquaday.
Day 4 in the Atlantian week is called Mermaidday.	Only one gang is working on the construction of the zin.
Day 5 in the Atlantian week is called Daydoldrum.	There are eight gold scales in a gold fin.

There are five days in an Atlantian week.	Each block costs 2 gold fins
The working day has 9 schlibs.	No works takes place on Daydoldrum.
Each worker takes rest periods during the working day totaling 16 ponks.	One member of each gang has religious duties and does not lay blocks.
There are 8 ponks in a schlib.	At any time when work is taking place there is a gang of 9 people on site.
Workers each lay 150 blocks per schlib.
